Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members of the Board of Trustees, and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of notice is attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the published notice and in the notice to the Trustees of this meeting. All proceedings of the Board were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public. The agenda was at all times available at the office for the District at Regency Center, Suite 300, 10250 Regency Circle, Omaha, Nebraska 68114.

The meeting was called to order. Upon roll call, all of the above referenced Trustees were present.

It was first publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review and indicated the location of such copy in the room where the meeting was being held.

There was next presented in accordance with the provisions of Neb. R.R.S. Section 77-1632, the publication concerning the Board of Trustees recommendation that the property tax request for tax year 2021-2022 be set at a different amount than the 2020-2021 tax request. It was further reported that no person had appeared at the meeting in response to such hearing notice. The Clerk was directed to attach a copy of such notice to the minutes of these proceedings.

After discussion and upon a motion duly made and seconded, and upon a roll call vote, the Trustees, Peggy L. Lawton, Jon Meyers, Wayne Breyfogle and Scott Pekarek voted "Aye" with none voting "Nay" with the following resolution being thereby adopted and approved:

RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 1of Cass County, Nebraska, that it is advisable that the property tax request for tax year 2021-2022 be set at a different amount than the 2020-2021 tax request as set out in the proof of publication attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, as follows:

1. The 2021-2022 property tax request be set at \$730,936.03 (\$1.497150), broken down as follows:

Bond Fund \$537,040.13 - \$1.100000 General Fund \$193,895.90 - \$0.397150 TOTAL \$730,936.03 - \$1.497150

- 2. The total assessed value of property differs from last year's total assessed value by 5%.
- 3. The tax rate which would levy the same amount of property taxes as last year, when multiplied by the new total assessed value of property, would be \$1.422909 per \$100 of assessed value.
- 4. The District proposes to adopt a property tax request that will cause its tax rate to be \$1.497150 per \$100 of assessed value, broken down as follows:

Bond Fund \$537,040.13 - \$1.100000 General Fund \$193,895.90 - \$0.397150 TOTAL \$730,936.03 - \$1.497150

- 5. Based on the proposed property tax request and changes in other revenue, the total operating budget of the District will increase last year's budget by 287%.
- 6. A copy of this resolution be certified and forwarded to the County Clerk on or before October 13, 2021.

Discussion was had concerning the budget hearing which was held immediately prior to this meeting. After a lengthy discussion and upon a motion duly made and seconded, and upon a roll call vote, the Trustees, Peggy L. Lawton, Jon Meyers, Wayne Breyfogle and Scott Pekarek, voted "Aye" with none voting "Nay" with the following resolution being thereby adopted and approved:

RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 1 of Cass County, Nebraska, that the budget and tax levy as tentatively set forth be adopted as the final budget and levy in accordance with Exhibit "A" attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof. Further that the Clerk of the District be directed to file a copy of the adopted budget with the levying board of the State Auditor's office as well as certifying the levy to the Cass County officials as well as attaching a proof of publication to such adopted budget.

With the budget for the District having been adopted, it was then stated that it would be appropriate at this time to levy the tax in accordance with the budget statement. After a full and complete discussion and upon a motion duly made and seconded, and upon the following roll call vote, the Trustees, Peggy L. Lawton, Jon Meyers, Wayne Breyfogle and Scott Pekarek voted "Aye" with none voting "Nay" thereby passing and adopting the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that Sanitary and Improvement District No. 1 of Cass County, Nebraska, levy and collect for the year 2021-2022 a tax of \$1.497150 per One Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$100.00) actual valuation of taxable property in the District, except intangible property, said tax to be credited to the appropriate fund as indicated below:

\$0.397150 on each One Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$100.00) actual valuation to be credited to the General Fund of the District and thereby collect \$193,895.90 in taxes to be credited to this fund; and

\$1.100000 on each One Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$100.00) actual valuation to be credited to the Construction (Bond) Fund of the District and thereby collect \$537,040.13 in taxes to be credited to this fund.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of this District be and hereby is directed to deliver and file with the County Clerk of Cass County, Nebraska and the Auditor of Public Accounts, a copy of this resolution.

The Board was next presented with consideration of its outstanding bills and invoices.

There was next presented a statement from Kraig J. Thelen, for services rendered in connection with Federal Disaster DR 4420 NE, Statement No. 30, for the month of August, in the amount of Four Hundred Twenty-Seven and 50/100 Dollars (\$427.50).

The Clerk next directed the attention of the Board of Trustees to the fact that D.A. Davidson & Co. will purchase Four Hundred Twenty-Seven and 50/100 Dollars (\$427.50) in warrants at this time and that the contracted charge for such purchase of warrants is two percent (2%) or Eight and 55/100 Dollars (\$8.55) in accordance with the financing agreement previously adopted by the Board. The Chairman recommended the issuance of a warrant for such amount to D.A. Davidson & Co.

There was next presented a statement from Nebraska Public Power District, for lighting at Highway 75, Account #211010041398, <u>having a small credit balance in the amount of Twenty-Three and 04/100 Dollars (\$23.04). The Board next directed advance payment to be made in the amount of One Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$100.00).</u>

There was next presented a statement from One Call Concepts, Inc., for line locates within the District, Invoice #1080567, in the amount of Four and 22/100 Dollars (\$4.22). <u>The Board was next reminded that it has a credit balance in the amount of Fifty-Three and 41/100 Dollars (\$53.41), so no payment is due at this time.</u>

There was next presented a statement from Nebraska Public Health Environmental Lab, for water testing, Invoice #542295, having a zero balance.

There was next presented correspondence from Jim Noerrlinger, presenting and requesting payment in favor of Helena Agri-Enterprises, LLC, for the purchase of herbicides, Invoice #301641154, in the amount of Five Hundred Eighty and no/100 Dollars (\$580.00).

There was next presented a statement from AgriVision Equipment Group, for the purchase of parts, Invoice #3435345, in the amount of Two Hundred Eighty-Eight and 56/100 Dollars (\$288.56).

There was next presented correspondence from Thompson, Dreessen & Dorner, Inc., engineers for the District, presenting and recommending payment in favor to Lake Waconda Association, for reimbursement to residents that paid for the silicate cure on the basketball court, Receipt from Logan

Contractors Supply, Invoice #Q90606, in the amount of One Hundred Eighty-Four and 04/100 Dollars (\$184.04).

There were next presented statements from Pansing Hogan Ernst & Bachman LLP, attorneys for the District, for legal services performed through August 31, 2021, as follows: (i) Miscellaneous District matters, in the aggregate amount of Four Thousand Two Hundred Twenty-Eight and 87/100 Dollars (\$4,228.87), and (ii) March 2019 Flood, in the amount of Six Thousand Five Hundred Sixty-Two and 45/100 Dollars (\$6,562.45); said statements being in the aggregate amount of Ten Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety-One and 32/100 Dollars (\$10,791.32).

The previously described bills, invoices, recommendations and statements having been presented for the Board's consideration and after review and discussion of such items, the following resolution was duly moved and passed on a $\underline{4-0}$ vote.

RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 1 of Cass County, Nebraska, that the Chairman and Clerk be and they hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver Warrant Nos. 5976 and 5977, of the District, dated the date of this meeting, to the following payees and in the following amount, said Warrants to be drawn on the **BOND** Fund of the District and to draw interest at the rate of five percent (5%) per annum (interest to be payable on February 10 of each year) and to be redeemed no later than September 14, 2026, subject to extension of said maturity date by order of the District Court of Cass County, Nebraska, after notice is given as required by law, to-wit:

Warrant No. 5976, for the amount of Four Hundred Twenty-Seven and 50/100 Dollars (\$427.50), payable to Kraig J. Thelen.

Warrant No. 5977, for the amount of Eight and 55/100 Dollars (\$8.55) payable to D.A. Davidson & Co.

FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 1 of Cass County, Nebraska, that the Chairman and Clerk be and they hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver Warrant Nos. 5978 through 5984, of the District, dated the date of this meeting, to the following payees and in the following amounts, said Warrants to be drawn on the General Fund of the District and to draw interest at the rate of six percent (6%) per annum and to be redeemed no later than September 14, 2024, subject to extension of said maturity date by order of the District Court of Cass County, Nebraska, after notice is given as required by law, to-wit:

Warrant No. 5978, for the amount of One Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$100.00), payable to Nebraska Public Power District, Account #211010041398.

Warrant No. 5979, for the amount of Five Hundred Eighty and no/100 Dollars (\$580.00), payable to Helena Agri-Enterprises, LLC.

Warrant No. 5980, for the amount of Two Hundred Eighty-Eight and 56/100 Dollars (\$288.56), payable to AgriVision Equipment Group.

Warrant No. 5981, for the amount of One Hundred Eighty-Four and 04/100 Dollars (\$184.04), payable to Lake Waconda Association.

Warrant Nos. 5982 and 5983, each for the amount of Five Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$5,000.00), and Warrant No. 5984, for the amount of Seven Hundred Ninety-One and 32/100 Dollars (\$791.32), payable to Pansing Hogan Ernst & Bachman LLP.

FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 1 of Cass County, Nebraska, that both they and the district hereby find and determine and covenant, warrant and agree as follows: the improvements and/or facilities being financed or refinanced by the above Warrants are for essential governmental functions and are designed to serve members of the general public on an equal basis; all said improvements have from the time of their first acquisition and construction been owned, are owned and are to be owned by the District or another political subdivision; to the extent special assessments have been or are to be levied for any of said improvements, such special assessments have been or are to be levied under Nebraska law as a matter of general application to all property specially benefited by said improvements in the District; the development of the land in the District is for residential or commercial use and the development of the land in the District for sale and occupation by the general public has proceeded and is proceeding with reasonable speed; other than any incidental use of said improvements by a developer during the initial period of development of said improvements, there have been, are and will be no persons with rights to use such improvements other than as members of the general public; none of the proceeds of said Bonds or any refinanced indebtedness have been or will be loaned to any private person or entity; the District hereby authorizes and directs the Chairperson or Clerk to file or cause to be filed, when due, an information reporting form pursuant to Section 149(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, pertaining to the above Warrants; and the District does not reasonably expect to sell or otherwise dispose of said improvements and/or facilities, in whole or in part, prior to the last maturity of the above Warrants.

FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 1 of Cass County, Nebraska, that the District hereby covenants, warrants and agrees as follows: (a) to take all actions necessary under current federal law to maintain the tax exempt status (as to taxpayers generally) of interest on the above Warrants; and (b) to the extent that it may lawfully do so, the District hereby designates the above Warrants as its "qualified tax exempt obligations" Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i)(III) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and covenants and warrants that the District does not reasonably expect to issue warrants or bonds or other obligations aggregating in the principal amount of more than \$10,000,000 during the calendar year in which the above Warrants are to be issued.

FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 1 of Cass County, Nebraska, that this and the preceding Resolutions are hereby adopted as the Certificate With Respect to Arbitrage of the District pertaining to the above Warrants and the District and the Chairman and Clerk of the District hereby further certify, as of the date of the registration of the above Warrants with the County Treasurer of Cass County, Nebraska, as follows:

- 1. No separate reserve or replacement fund has been or will be established with respect to the above Warrants. reasonably anticipates that monies in its Bond Fund reasonably attributable to the above Warrants in excess of the lesser of: (a) ten percent (10%) of the net principal proceeds of the above Warrants, (b) the maximum annual debt service due on the above Warrants, or (c) one hundred twenty-five percent (125%) of average annual debt service due on the above Warrants will be expended for payment of principal of and interest on the above Warrants within thirteen (13) months after receipt of such monies. That amount which is currently held in the District's Bond Fund which exceeds the amount which is to be expended for payment of principal and interest on the above Warrants within thirteen (13) months after receipt of such monies, plus that amount arrived at pursuant to the immediately preceding sentence, will not be invested in any securities or any other investment obligations which bear a yield, as computed in accordance with the actuarial method, in excess of the yield on the above Warrants.
- 2. To the best of their knowledge, information and belief, the above expectations are reasonable.
- 3. The District has not been notified of any listing of it by the Internal Revenue Service as an issuer that may not certify its bonds.
- 4. This Certificate is being passed, executed and delivered pursuant to Section 1.148-2(b)(2) of the Income Tax regulations under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.
